



Program Overview

During summer 2025, AAWDC's FutureSuccess program empowered Anne Arundel County youth and young adults—particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds—to gain hands-on experience, build professional skills, and explore career pathways.

This five-week paid internship program, held July 7th – August 8th, placed participants with businesses in diverse industries including healthcare, technology, and the public sector. Interns not only strengthened their professional skills, but also discovered potential future opportunities that align with their goals.

The program concluded with a celebratory Closing Ceremony, where interns were honored for their achievements and businesses were recognized for their partnership in shaping the next generation of the county's workforce.
