2025 Raising the Bar Conference

AAWDC staff attended the Maryland Workforce Association's Raising the Bar Youth Forum and Annual Conference in September. Eight team members represented AAWDC as presenters, demonstrating our leadership across key workforce development topics. Hospitality Hiring Event

In August, AAWDC held a Hospitality Hiring Event at the Anne Arundel County Career Center to highlight opportunities in one of the region's top industries. Nine businesses and 81 job seekers were in attendance, engaging in on-the-spot interviews and networking opportunities. The event provided a valuable platform for local employers to connect with qualified candidates and for job seekers to explore career paths in hospitality.



Future Business Owners Camp

This summer, AAWDC's Future Business Owners Camp, held in partnership with University Startups, gave Anne Arundel County students the opportunity to explore entrepreneurship and learn what it takes to launch and run a successful business. Over the course of the week, participants transformed innovative ideas into viable business models while strengthening financial literacy, technical skills, and soft skills such as communication and problemsolving. By the end of the program, participants reported greater confidence, motivation, and understanding of business fundamentals.



Post-Pandemic Workforce Survey

AAWDC, in partnership with the Anne Arundel Economic Development Corporation (AAEDC) and the Anne Arundel County Office of Emergency Management (OEM), released the Anne Arundel County Post-Pandemic Workforce Survey Report.
